At a regular meeting of Jessup Borough Council held June 5, 2024.

Roberta Galati said we had an executive meeting concerning acquisition of property and Litigation.

Roberta Galati, President of Council was chairperson of the meeting and asked all present to join in the Pledge of Allegiance. Mr. Wascura had roll call.

Roberta Galati said what a great job our DPW and Police Force did with the Saint Ubaldo Parade and race, also thanking the Citizens of Healthy Jessup and Sierra Club for cleaning up the streets the next day.

Lackawanna Energy Report: Harry said he has no report and was glad that the Borough had a successful Festival.

Solicitor Maura Armezzani Tunis said that for purposes of the agenda that motion E will be amended to state Motion to take from the table an ordinance making Ward and Short streets a one way. They are not substituting changes to the agenda, just in terms of how

they are worded. They don't change the substance. We will be making amendments prior to Public Comment where Public be aware of.

REPORTS:

Mayor welcomed everyone to the meeting, We need to appreciate and thank our DPW and Police Force starting with the Wine Tasting, Traffic Control, greeting the Italian Flag, and Saint Ubaldo Festival. They did a lot of work other than blocking the street for fireworks. One request from people that frequent the VFW is that there are racoons in the home across the street and if they knock the house down want animal control to be present.

Mayor also said he welcomes Dee Kays Corner Deli Hoagie Shop in Jessup from Olyphant it is where Mafalda's used to be. The construction crew on Bridge Street notified the mayor that they would not work on Friday. He said the welcome sign by Cousins Store is gone and should be put back in that area, the sign on Bridge Street should also be moved after the

completion of the job. He asked about a customer not being able to get Gas on Delaware street. Wascura said sometimes they won't bring gas in unless there is a certain number of customers on that street.

CONTROLLER;

Benjamin Cardoni said he didn't hear any complaints in town .Mr. Cirba and Chief Berta did a great job .He read the Financial report for everyone to hear.

Tax collector.

Genevieve Lupini report was attached to the agenda.

ZONING OFFICER; NEIC, ANTHONY MENGONI-

Anthony said that notices have been sent to properties in question. He will try to take care of the Raccoon problem. Betti asked if 803 Church street had a permit, Anthony said no and that if they didn't pull one they will be at the Magistrates.

POLICE DEPARTMENT; CHIEF ROBERT BERTA;

The Chief gave his report and said there were 355 incidents for the month. Mr. Camoni also thanked the DPW and Chief for all their fine work.

DPW; FOREMAN JOSEPH CIRBA; THE Report was attached.

ENGINEER; PETERS CONSULTANTS, INC . Mr. Peters report is attached.

SOLICITOR; MAURA ARMEZZANI TUNIS.

Maura said she did make contact and there were 2 items that we couldn't get to address from the audit we received. Foster and Foster contacted her and said they wouldn't be able to handle actuarial calculations in terms of what we need to comply with the audit. The fee was Three hundred (300) dollars .We could consider that at the next meeting or in the interim to respect the audit. Maura said she would like to thank everyone for their work, and as a citizen of Jessup and anytime a Solicitor isn't called it's a good day. Mr. Crinella asked about the noise problem. Maura said she had a conversation with Pat Walsh who represents Mr. Spatt. I still haven't heard from Judge Gibbons. Jerry asked if there was a time limit and Maura said they have no frame or reference for a timeline. They will respond on Monday. Crinella said the last six weeks of monitoring has shown the noise level at a lower rate. They operated at decreased noise level which shows that they can. If we can submit to Judge Gibbons , Maura said we can't submit anything right now. Curt Camoni asked if we contacted the LCB about taking over the monitoring of noise at the VFW. He would like to make a proposal to be considered on the agenda for next month's meeting for our Police force to take over. Curt said let Jessup's problems be enforced by our Police who

use common sense and discretion with each situation they run into. We wouldn't have to wait for testing or the Zoning Officer to send a letter.

Curt Camoni said he would like to see if our Police could take over the noise ordinance in town, if there was a problem in town the Police could monitor the readings of the complaint. The LCB law is 75 Decibels, and the Borough Ordinance is Lower at 55 Decibels.

Mr. Crinella said we support the Veterans and don't know if the people know we are enforcing the noise ordinance. Maura said we would have to see if the Council wanted to raise the decibel level. Mr. Crinella thinks if you have the police enforcing the noise ordinance, everyone should be treated the same. Roberta Galati is afraid we will open a can of worms if we try to enforce different sections of town.

Curt Camoni said a bunch of Veterans at the VFW trying to have some music at their Pavilion, they should be able to do this. The Borough should let the VFW utilize their facilities.

Mr. Fiorelli believes we need to do a test for the noise Ordinance. Maura says we would have to enforce the noise ordinance according to our ordinance. The last ordinance was in 2020, do we want to amend our ordinance? Mr. Fiorelli thinks that if a bar has music playing they could control it with the controls .Curt said if a bar has a complaint against it the LCB doesn't give a warning they will cite the establishment.

Mr. Crinella does support the Veterans, but monitoring we can't have selective enforcement in town at all. If Decibel level was increased by Council or timeline.

Mr. Wascura said the Borough might have to change their Decibel levels and the time at which noise must stop at night. He said Decibels can be measured on your cell phone and the VFW could try putting up soundproof wall panels to help block the noise.

Curt would like the Borough to enforce its own rules, but Jerry thinks there would be a problem with this. Jerry asked the Chief if we know who calls in the complaints? Chief said sometimes it is anonymous. Maura thinks we would need a proposed area for exemption making it more restrictive. Roberta said the residential homes were here first. Mr. Fiorelli said you could mitigate the level of sound to work at 75 decibels.

JEFF SMITH 913 Church Street

Jeff gave a zoning report to the Council thanking Tom and Jen for all their help getting their attendance scheduled. They spent two Thursdays at classes and training and said the Borough Zoning Board does a great job along with the Planning Commission. Mr. Wascura thanked Jeff and the other members that attended the classes.



- UGI provided documentation showing the depth of the existing gas line. The depth varies from form to form and per UGI, “For the exact location and depths, field verification would be needed.” We will work with the contractor will avoid the gas lines in the field as they are encountered.

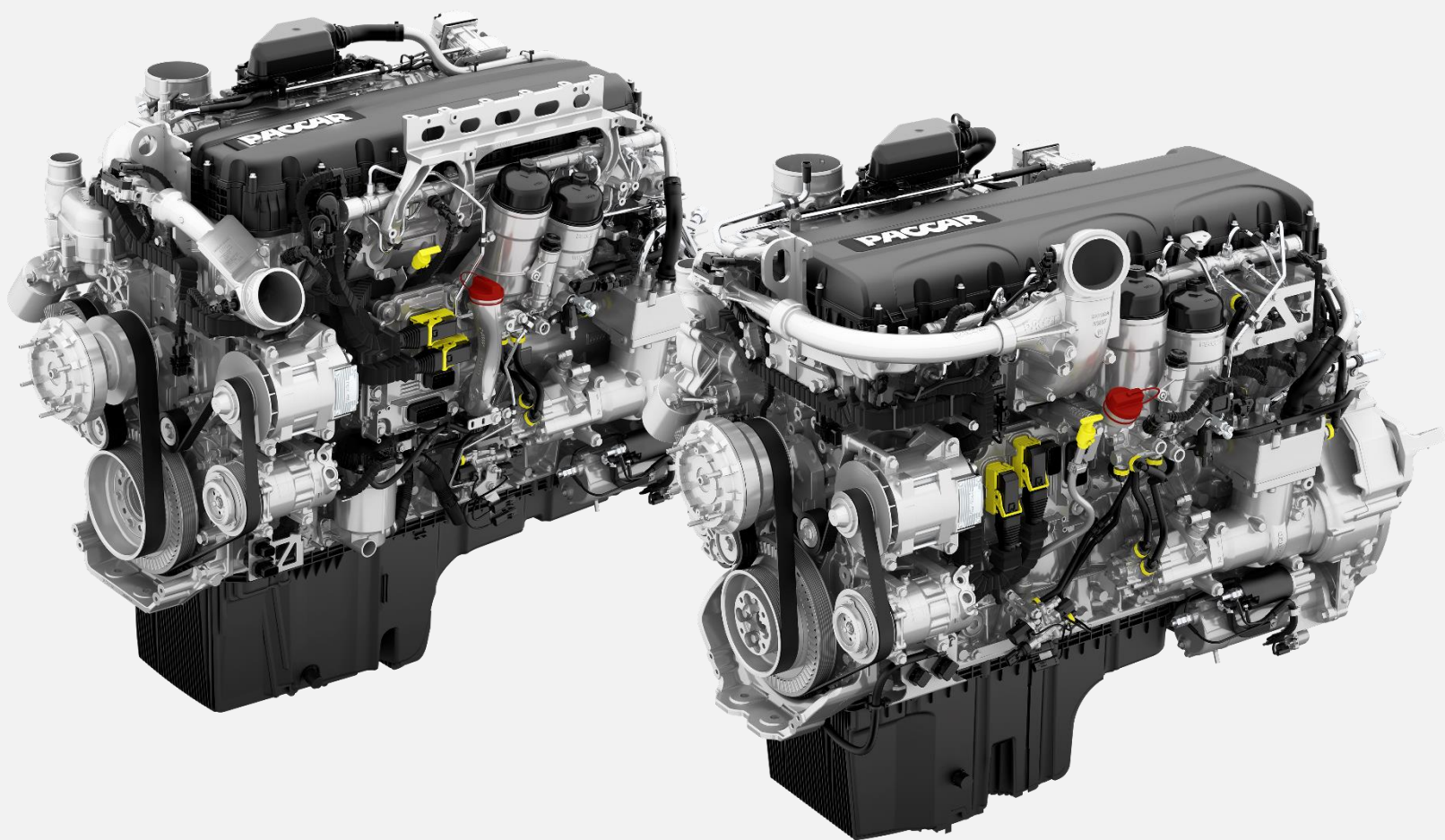

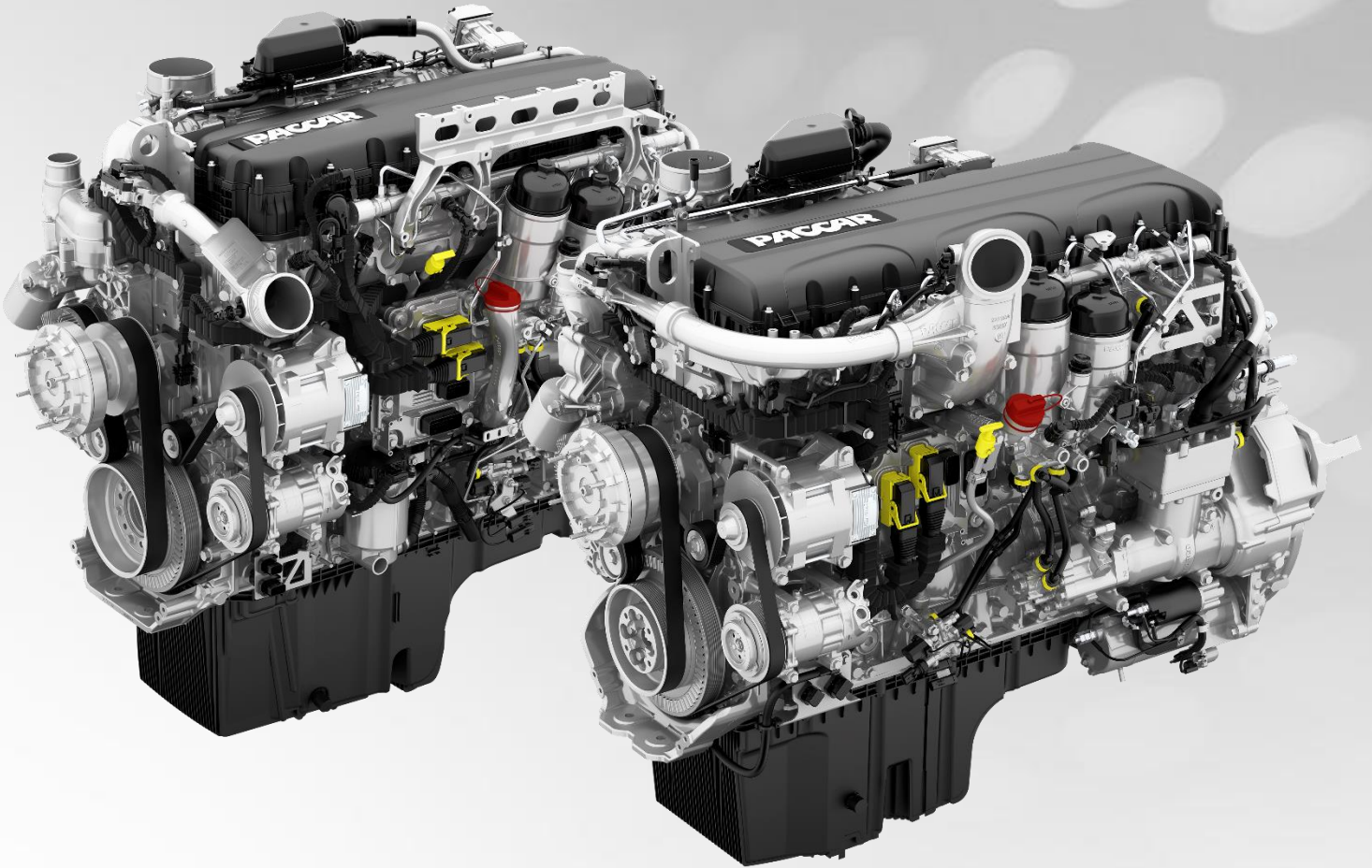

ORDINANCE No. ___-2024

AN ORDINANCE GOVERNING ANIMALS, FERAL CATS AND ANIMALS RUNNING AT LARGE WITHIN THE BOROUGH OF JESSUP AND PROVIDING FOR FINES AND PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEROF

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Jessup is duly empowered by the Borough Code to enact certain regulations relating to the public health, safety and welfare of the Citizens of the Borough of Jessup; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Jessup is duly empowered by the Borough Code to enact certain regulations relating the power to prohibit or regulate by ordinance, the running at large of dogs, cats or other pets and, in the enforcement of these regulations, to direct the seizure and detention of dogs, cats and other pets; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Jessup is duly empowered by the Borough Code to impose fines and penalties, or to remit the same; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Jessup is duly empowered to prohibit and remove any nuisance on public or private grounds within the Borough of Jessup; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Jessup is duly empowered by the Borough Code to impose fines and penalties, or to remit the same; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Borough of Jessup Council, Lackawanna County, Pennsylvania, and

NOW, THEREFORE BE, BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Jessup Borough Council, Lackawanna County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby **ENACTED** and **ORDAINED** by the Jessup Borough Council as follows:

SECTION 1. Definitions.

For the purpose of this Ordinance, the following terms shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context in which the word is used clearly indicates otherwise. Words not specifically defined in this Ordinance shall have their usual and customary meaning:

- A. **ANIMAL**: Any dog, cat, domesticated animal or non-domesticated animal.

- B. **BOROUGH**: The Borough of Jessup, Lackawanna County, the Council of the Borough of Jessup and any duly authorized agent or representative of the Borough

of Jessup or the Jessup Borough Council specifically including, but not necessarily limited to, the Jessup Borough Manager, the Jessup Borough Code Enforcement Officers, and members of the Jessup Borough Police Department.

- C. **CAREGIVER:** Any person who provides care, food, water, shelter or medical care to feral cats in accordance with a program approved by the Borough of Jessup to trap, neuter, vaccinate, ear-tip, and return feral cats to the location at which they are trapped.
- D. **FERAL CAT:** An unowned, free-roaming cat that is either partially socialized or unsocialized to humans and resists contact with humans.
- E. **LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER:** For purposes of this Ordinance, a Law Enforcement Officer shall include Police Officers of the Borough of Jessup, the Jessup Borough Code Enforcement Officers and the Jessup Borough Manager.
- F. **MOTOR VEHICLE:** A vehicle which is self-propelled except one which is propelled solely by human power or electric power obtained by overhead trolley wires, but not operated upon rails.
- G. **NUISANCE:** An animal shall be considered a nuisance if it habitually trespasses upon or damages either private or public property or annoys or harms lawful owners, users or occupants thereof.
- H. **OWNER:** Any person having a right of property in, having custody of or who harbors or permits, a dog, cat, domestic animal or a non-domesticated animal to remain on or around his or her property, excluding feral cat caregivers as defined herein.
- I. **PERSON:** A natural person, firm, partnership, association, corporation or any other legal entity.
- J. **POLICE OFFICER:** Any person employed by the Borough of Jessup whose duty it is to preserve peace, is authorized to make arrests or to enforce any law, specifically including, but not necessarily limited to, auxiliary policeman.
- K. **RUNNING AT LARGE:** Any animal that is upon any public highway, street, alley, park or any other public land or upon property of another person, other than

the owner of the animal, which is not firmly secured by means of a collar, leash, chain or other device such that it cannot stray, or any animal not accompanied by, or under the immediate reasonable control of, a person, is considered running at large.

- L. **SPONSOR**: An eligible animal welfare organization specifically appointed by the Borough of Jessup to operate a Trap Neuter and Return Program {TNR Program) in the Borough of Jessup.
- M. **STRAY CAT**: A domestic cat who once had a home but is now without a home by reason of being lost or abandoned.
- N. **TRAP, NEUTER AND RETURN PROGRAM (TNR Program)**: A non-lethal approach to feral cat population control in which feral cats are humanely trapped, sterilized, vaccinated, ear-tipped and then returned to the location at which they were originally trapped.
- O. **VEHICLE**: Every device in, upon or by which any person or property is or may be transported or driven upon any highway, street, road or alley except devices used exclusively upon rails or tracks.

SECTION 2. Prohibition Against Disturbing or Loud Noise.

No person shall allow any animal confined or otherwise kept on that person's premises to make any loud or harsh noise or disturbance which shall interfere with, or deprive the peace, quiet, rest or sleep of, any person within the Borough of Jessup.

SECTION 3. Unsanitary Nuisance: exemptions.

- A. No person shall allow any animal owned by, possessed by or under the control of said person to defecate on any public or private property, sidewalk, walkway or other property of another without immediately cleaning it up by completely removing the feces of said animal from said property.
- B. Any person with a properly documented impairment of vision or mobility who relies upon a dog specifically trained to assist the person in connection with such a visual or mobility impairment shall be exempt from compliance with this section upon presentation to the Borough of Jessup of proper documentation of such visual or mobility impairment.

SECTION 4. Prohibition Against Animals Running at Large.

- A. No person shall permit any animal owned by, possessed by or under the control of said person to run at large at any time upon the public streets, alleys, highways, or public grounds of the Borough of Jessup; upon the private property of any other person or upon any property other than property belonging to either the owner or possessor of such animal or to a person under whose supervision or control such animal is being maintained. In public, an animal must at all times either be firmly secured by means of a collar, leash, chain or other restrictive device such that the animal cannot stray, or the animal must be accompanied by, or under the reasonable immediate control of, some person.
- B. Any police officer or law enforcement officer is hereby authorized and empowered to seize and detain: (i) any animal which is found running at large in the Borough of Jessup (ii) any animal which is on any property other than the property of the owner or possessor of such animal and (c) any animal unaccompanied by the owner or possessor of such animal when such police officer or law enforcement office is in immediate pursuit of such animal.
- C. The provisions of this section shall apply to all animals found running at large in the Borough of Jessup in violation of this section, irrespective of payment for, or issuance of, any license with respect to the animal involved.
- D. The Borough of Jessup Council is hereby empowered and authorized to engage the services of a qualified and suitable person to enforce the provisions of this Section.

SECTION 5. Seizure, Detention and Impounding of Animals Running at Large.

Any police officer or law enforcement officer of the Borough of Jessup is hereby authorized to seize, detain and/or impound either any animal running at large in violation of any provision of this Ordinance or any animal concerning which information has been received that such animal has been running at large. Any animal so seized shall be held by the Borough of Jessup for up to forty-eight (48) hours. Immediate notice of such seizure, either by personal notice or by written notice via e-mail or regular mail shall be given to the person in whose name the license for such animal, if any, was issued, or to that person's agent,

informing said person that said person is to claim such animal within forty- eight (48) hours after such a seizure and detention. In the event that the animal seized and detained does not bear a proper license tag, immediate notice of such seizure, either by personal notice or by written notice via e-mail or regular mail shall be given to the person known to be the owner or possessor of such animal, if known, or to that person's agent, if known. The owner, possessor or claimant of an animal so seized and detained for running at large in violation of this Ordinance shall pay a fine of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) to the Borough of Jessup, together with any additional charges as the Jessup Borough Council may set forth from time to time by Resolution of the Jessup Borough Council for the per diem cost of feeding and sheltering any such animal so seized and detained. No animal shall be returned to the owner or possessor of said animal or to the person otherwise claiming such animal until said penalty and expenses and charges shall have been paid in full. If no owner or possessor of any such animal seized and detained is known, the animal may be held by the Borough of Jessup for up to forty-eight (48) hours.

SECTION 6. Disposition of any Unclaimed Animal.

If, after forty-eight (48) hours following the notice as set forth in Section 5 above, or after forty- eight (48) hours of the seizure and detention of an animal with no known owner or possessor, such animal has not been claimed, the police officer or law enforcement officer shall convey the animal to a shelter, animal rescue, or foster care. No licensed animal shall be adopted, sold or otherwise disposed of unless such licensed animal remains unclaimed for five (5) days after written notification to the licensed owner at the address identified on the license, either via e-mail or certified United States Mail, return receipt requested, at the option of the Borough of Jessup. Where the owner or agent of an unlicensed animal is not known, the police officer or law enforcement officer shall convey such animal to a shelter, animal rescue, or foster care. No animal shall be sold for the purpose of vivisection or research or be conveyed in any manner for such purposes.

SECTION 7. Transportation of Animals.

No person other than the person actually walking a dog or other animal for agricultural purposes shall transport or carry on any public highway, street, road or alley such dog or other animal, unless such dog or animal is safely enclosed within the motor vehicle or protected by a container, cage, cross tether or other device to prevent the dog or animal from falling from, being thrown from or jumping out from said motor vehicle.

SECTION 8. Unattended Animal.

No person shall leave a dog or other animal in any unattended motor vehicle or structure without adequate ventilation, sanitary conditions or in such a manner as to subject the dog or other animal to extreme temperature which may adversely affect the health and safety of the dog or animal.

SECTION 9. Responsibilities of Cat Owners Regarding Stray Cats.

It shall be unlawful for any owner or possessor of any cat to permit such cat to run free outside the residence of its owner or possessor unless such cat has been:

- A. Neutered or spayed to prevent procreating;
- B. Immunized against rabies in compliance with Pennsylvania law; and,
- C. Appropriately "tipped" on the left ear to signify that it has been neutered/spayed and immunized.

SECTION 10. Feeding Stray or Feral Cats.

It shall be unlawful for any person to feed any stray or feral cat as such feeding causes a nuisance to the Borough of Jessup and its residents and creates a condition contrary to the health, safety, and welfare of the Borough of Jessup and its residents. It shall not be unlawful for any person participating in a Trap, Neuter and Return Program (TNR Program) specifically authorized by the Borough of Jessup or for a Sponsor to feed stray or feral cats.

SECTION 11. Duties and Responsibilities of TNR Program Sponsors

Animal welfare organizations, or any other qualified person, may make application to the Borough of Jessup to serve as a Sponsor of a Trap, Neuter and Return Program (TNR Program). Sponsors authorized by the Borough of Jessup shall have the following duties and responsibilities:

- A. Sponsors must register with the Jessup Borough Manager each feral cat colony the Sponsor is managing with the Borough of Jessup. Information submitted to the Borough of Jessup shall include general location (neighborhood), number of cats in the colony, and number of caretakers working the colony.

- B. Sponsors must provide a written report to the Borough of Jessup, on an annual basis, recording and reporting on the intake and disposition of each feral cat brought to the Sponsor's facility. This written report is due on December 31 of each year the Sponsor has been authorized to act as a Sponsor within the Borough of Jessup.
- C. Sponsors must provide a written report to the Borough of Jessup, on an annual basis, recording and reporting on the number of sterilized members of each feral cat colony within the Borough of Jessup for which they have implemented a TNR program. This written report is due on December 31 of each year the Sponsor has been authorized to act as a Sponsor within the Borough of Jessup.
- D. Sponsors must provide a written report to the Borough of Jessup, on an annual basis, recording and reporting on the number of kittens born into each feral colony within the Jessup Borough for which they have implemented a TNR program. This written report is due on December 31 of each year the Sponsor has been authorized to act as a Sponsor within the Borough of Jessup.
- E. Sponsors must address complaints received by the Borough of Jessup and passed along to the Sponsor regarding caretaker behavior and Sponsors must serve as an intermediary to address and, where possible, remediate such behavior within a reasonable period of time, based on the matters at issue and utilizing Borough of Jessup resources when necessary.

SECTION 12. Violations and Penalties.

- A. Subject to the other terms of this Ordinance, any person who violates any provision of this Ordinance commits a summary offense and, upon conviction thereof for a first offense, shall be subject to a fine of not less than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) nor more than Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00), plus all costs of prosecution, shall be subject to imprisoned for up to ninety (90) days, or both.
- B. For any second or subsequent offense that occurs within three hundred and sixty-five (365) days of sentencing for the prior violation, a person shall be charged with a summary offense, and upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not less than Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00), plus all costs of prosecution, and be subject to up to imprisonment for up to ninety (90) days, or both.
- C. Each day there is a violation of this Ordinance constitutes a separate violation of this

Ordinance.

SECTION 13. Continuation of Past Ordinance Provisions.

The provisions of the Ordinance, as far as they are the same as those of ordinances in force immediately prior to the enactment of this Ordinance, are intended as a continuation of such ordinances and not as new enactments. The provisions of this Ordinance shall not affect any such suit or prosecuting pending or to be instituted to enforce any right or penalty or to punish any offense under the authority of any ordinance repealed by this Ordinance.

SECTION 14. Severance.

The provisions of this Ordinance are severable, and if any of its provisions shall be held to be unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of any of the remaining provisions of this Ordinance. It is hereby declared as the legislative intent of the Jessup Borough Council that this Ordinance would have been adopted had such unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid provision not been included herein.

SECTION 15. Effective Date.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency. In the event that any provision, section, sentence, clause of part of this Ordinance shall be held to be invalid, such invalidity shall not effect of impair any remaining provision, section, sentence, clause or part of this Ordinance. It is the intent of this Borough that such remainder shall be and shall remain in full force and effect.

This Ordinance shall become effective five (5) days from the enactment of this Ordinance.
